## **WELCOME**

Thank you for your interest in the Australian Kodály Certificate Course 2025.

The AKC is the only fully accredited and nationally recognised Australian program of teacher training in the Kodály approach to music education. The AKC was established some 30 years ago and during this time, hundreds of teachers have successfully completed the requirements. The Course is normally completed over three years of part-time study.

The curriculum for the AKC has been modelled on outstanding international Kodály programs and adapted to suit the needs of Australian educators. It is comprehensive and involves a mixture of both hands-on (practical) and lecture-style tuition. The course curriculum sets out at least 60 contact hours of study at each level across Musicianship, Pedagogy, Practicum, Materials, Ensemble (Choir) and Conducting.

In 2025, Kodály Western Australia will deliver the AKC on Tuesday evenings over 22 weeks during the school year. This model allows participants to incorporate ideas more quickly into their teaching.

We encourage you to take advantage of this unique opportunity for professional development.

# **AKC COURSE OVERVIEW**

AKC Course participants undertake a total of 60 hours of study across six modules: Musicianship, Pedagogy, Practicum, Cultural Materials, Ensemble (Choir) and Conducting.

### **MUSICIANSHIP (15 HOURS)**

Enjoy singing and performing a range of musical works in a fun and supportive learning environment. Develop your sight-reading, sight- singing, aural perception, theory and partwork skills through active music-making using the tools of the Kodály approach (moveable tonic sol-fa, rhythmic syllables and Curwen hand signs). Participants are invited to choose the class that best suits their musical needs and experience. Everyone is welcome - from beginners to experienced musicians.

### PEDAGOGY (15 HOURS)

Learn new songs, games, dances and musical works to engage your students. Study strategies of curriculum design, teaching, planning and assessment appropriate for delivery of a sequential and developmental music program. Knowledge and skills gained in this course will support teachers in meeting the requirements of the Australian curriculum. Participants will choose to specialise in one of three streams: Early Childhood, Primary or Secondary Music Education.

## PRACTICUM (5 HOURS)

Engage in practical micro-teaching experiences of the skills and concepts studied in Pedagogy. Reflective practice is encouraged through a supportive peer-learning environment where participants take on the role of both teacher and student.

## **CULTURAL MATERIALS (5 HOURS)**

Learn, collect and analyse the folk music of Australia and other nations to determine suitability for pedagogical processes outlined in pedagogy, and the use of this material in a developmental music program.



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### CHOIR (10 HOURS)

The Course Choir is your opportunity to perform quality choral music. Daily rehearsals featuring rehearsal strategies and warm-ups that can be readily applied in your own teaching context.

### **CONDUCTING (10 HOURS)**

Learn about rehearsal strategies, repertoire and conducting techniques through active music-making and conducting the class (vocal) ensemble. Taught by experienced conductors, participants will have the freedom to choose the class that best suits their teaching context and musical needs.

  must be PAID in full by the indicated date. Please note, payment can only be made once
  the invoice is processed following completion of registration form.
- STANDARD registration closes Monday 24 February 2025. Registration after this date is not guaranteed and may incur extra costs.
- To qualify for the TERTIARY STUDENT rate, you must be enrolled in full-time tertiary study at the time of the course. Proof of enrolment will be required when you join as a member of Kodály Australia.
- Completing the FULL COURSE for ASSESSMENT includes tuition and assessment in all
  modules. Full course participants who successfully pass all modules can apply for credit
  towards the Australian Kodály Certificate.
- Completing the FULL COURSE or SINGLE SUBJECTS for AUDIT includes TUITION ONLY in all
  modules but does not allow for assessment and credit towards the Australian Kodály
  Certificate.
